← Chapter XVII. Recollections of Col. Willoughby Williams

On the Cumberland, near the Shoals, lived Enoch Dozier, a wealthy man, good citizen, and a large land-owner. He has two sons, Dennis and Willoughby Dozier, still living in the same neighborhood.

In the name of God, Amen.

I Enoch Dauge of the County of Davidson & State of Tennessee, being in common health, but old, and knowing, according to the course of human nature, that I cannot live many years longer; & wishing to make distribution of the property & effects with which I am blessed; do make this my last Will & Testament as follows, to wit.

Item 1st. I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Dauge, during her natural life, the plantation on which I live, & all the lands adjoining, except what has been deeded away by me this day. Also eight negroes, her choice of all my negroes, ^{Others herein specifically deeded.} except Charles. Also two yoke of steers & two ox carts, seven cows & calves or yearlings to be chosen by her. six head horses, twenty five head of sheep & sixty head of turkeys her choice. Also bacon enough to last her till the killing time, also corn, fodder, oats &c. sufficient for her use till another crop be made. Also also all household & kitchen furniture of every description, & farming utensils, & blacksmiths tools, & still & still furniture. Also five hundred dollars in money to laid out in household furniture for her use.

2^d. As I have given to all my children by deed of this date, what I consider to be, an equal distributive share of my lands, except to Grandy & Dozier & David T Dozier, & wishing to make them all equal in that respect, Therefore,

I give & bequeath to my son Grandy & Dozier two hundred & seventy four acres of land on Sams creek deeded to me by James Russell, by deed dated the 18th of September 1804, to him & his heirs forever.

3^d. I give & bequeath to my son David T Dozier, such a portion of the farm on which I now live as is included from the west boundary line of the lot &

I purchased of Peter Dozier by deed dated the 13th day of January 1807, to the line of George S Allen below, all from the river between these two lines that lies southwardly & adjoining, to be possessed by him at the death of my said wife. Also fifty acres that lies south of & adjoins both Allen's land & the above named land, to him & his heirs forever.

4th I give & bequeath to my son Enoch Dozier a negro man by the name of Charles, to him & his heirs forever.

5th I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy B Stamp a negro girl named Milly, to her & her heirs forever.

6th I give & bequeath to my grandson Enoch Dozier of Dennis Dozier a negro boy named Isham, now in the house of Dennis Dozier, to him & his heirs forever.

7th I give ^{& bequeath} to my grandson Willoughby Dozier son of Willoughby Dozier a negro girl named Maria now in his house, to him & his heirs forever.

8th I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Margaret Stump, a negro girl named Picky, now at Grandy Dozier's, to her & her heirs forever.

9th I will & devise that the land on the upper end of the farm on which I live, lying south of the river, & the North west corner on the river of the land purchased by me of Peter Dozier, to the North west corner of the land on the river this day deeded by me to my daughter Anna B Stamp, be sold, at the death of my wife, on a credit of one & two years, & the proceeds divided equally among all my children.

10th I will & devise that all my negroes not herein before specifically devised be divided equally among my eight children, to wit, Dennis Dozier, Willoughby Dozier, Enoch Dozier, Anna B Stamp, Grandy E Dozier, Nancy B Stamp, David T Dozier & Edney Dozier.

11th. I will & devise that all other property & effects of every kind & description, that I may die possessed of, be equally divided among my aforesaid eight children, to hold to them & their heirs forever.

12th. I appoint my two sons Dennis Dozier & Willoughby Dozier and my son in law F. H. Stump my Executors to carry into effect this my last Will & testament.

In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand & my seal this nineteenth day of May in the year our Lord One thousand eight hundred & forty one.

The Dozier surname has deep roots in early American history and is widely recognized as originating from French Huguenot families. The name derives from French forms such as *Dossier*, *Dozière*, or *Des Orsières*, and many Dozier families were Protestant refugees who fled France following the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685, which stripped Huguenots of religious protection.

Most American Doziers arrived in the late seventeenth or early eighteenth century, often traveling through England or the Netherlands before settling in the American colonies. The earliest documented Dozier families appear in Virginia, South Carolina, and North Carolina, from which later generations followed a familiar southern migration pattern—moving inland and westward through the Carolinas into Georgia, Alabama, and ultimately Tennessee. This path aligns precisely with the locations found in the Dozier family tree, including South Carolina, Pickens County, Alabama, and Nashville, Tennessee.

Based on historical and genealogical evidence, the Dozier family was established in America well before the American Revolution and did not arrive as nineteenth-century immigrants. By the 1700s, Doziers were already fully embedded in colonial society as landholders and professionals, a legacy that continued into the nineteenth century with physicians, clergy, and community leaders. The presence of a physician named Dr. Dozier in Nashville by 1900 fits squarely within this long-established pattern of a multi-generation Southern family rooted in early American history.

The earliest documented Dozier arrival in America is **Jean (or John) Dozier**, who is recorded as having arrived in the **Virginia Colony in 1686**. His name appears in Virginia court and land records in the 1690s, providing firm evidence of his presence in colonial America well before formal passenger lists were routinely kept. Because most ship manifests from the 1680s have not survived, these early court and land entries serve as accepted proof of arrival.

Jean Dozier and others bearing the name were part of the broader **French Huguenot migration**, fleeing religious persecution in France following the **Revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685**. French Protestant refugees often established themselves by registering land grants, taking oaths of allegiance, and joining local militias or churches, which is how historians are able to trace their arrival and settlement in the New World. Supporting evidence for this early Dozier presence includes Virginia land and county records from the late seventeenth century, early Huguenot church membership lists, and colonial militia rosters.

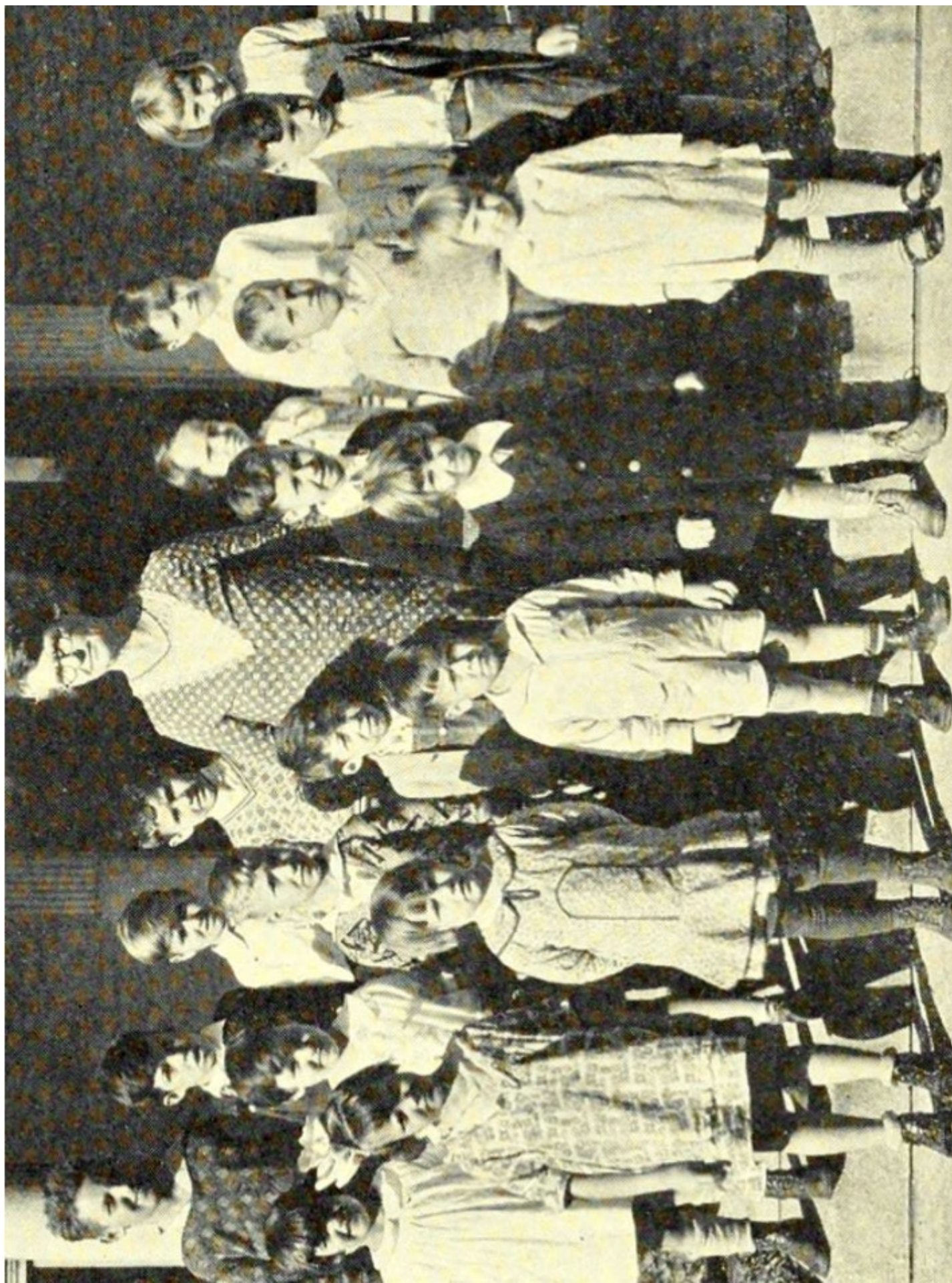

THE 1946 WEDDING TRIP

On the morning of May 9, 1946, as I was preparing to leave for my work at the Post Office, I found two letters in my mailbox postmarked New York City. Upon opening the first envelope I found that it was an invitation to attend the wedding of Miss Loraze Duncan and Mr. Robert Marker which was to take place on June 5 in New York. Overcome with surprise, I opened the other letter which was from Loraze, who had been a photographer's model in New York for two years. She told me that she and Bob had decided to be married on the anniversary of their class graduation from East Nashville School back in 1940 and that they were sending invitations to all their classmates so that it might be a reunion as well as a wedding.

I was so excited that I could hardly wait to tell Eleanor Tyne, who also worked at the Post Office. I found that she too had received her invitation. At lunch we met our excited friends, Mary Stepp and Anne Hyde, who were working at Life and Casualty Insurance Company.

After three weeks of shopping and excitement, finally on the morning of June 5, Eleanor, Ruth Taylor, Vivienne Hicks, and I went to Union Station to take the train for New York. We were surprised to see so many of our classmates there for the same purpose. In fact, it seemed as if the whole train would be filled with the 1940 class of East. In line at the ticket window were my old friends, Fred Stroud and Charles Hardiman, both professors at George Peabody College, and Jane Kirkwood buying tickets for Elynor Shivers and Lillian Rucker, all three of whom were nurses at St. Thomas Hospital. Also in line, was William Payne, buying tickets for himself and his wife, the former Betty Williams. Seeing that I would have to wait to buy my ticket, the girls and I moved around and talked to all these old friends. We went to talk to a group about the drinking fountain (an old East High habit). The group looking at the picture of the two-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Crook, the former Evelyn Cochran, consisted mostly of married couples, Billy Peacher and his wife, who was Helen Cooper, and Mr. and Mrs. Lyle Fulton, who was Louise Gordon.

When I saw the line thinning at the ticket window and my companions already in line, I went over to buy my ticket. Eleanor and Ruth had been talking to Josephine Denton and Dorothy Castleman who were now working in the Doctors Building. Josephine told them that Linna Adams, who also worked there, was not able to go to the wedding. Vivienne said that she had just seen Juanita Martin, the basketball coach of the champion Y. M. C. A. team. She told Vivienne that she was going to meet Edith Cantrell, who had married Tud Ralls, the famous professional football star, in Cincinnati. Charles Matthews, now an insurance salesman and his wife, Mary Miller Black, were also in this group.

About that time the conductor shouted, "All aboard," and the whole station seemed to be going down to the train. There were so many whom I had not yet seen. Since I would have the whole trip and three whole days to visit, however, I was not worried. I was surprised and delighted to find that Vivian Cheek and Marie Fly had the "upper" in our section. Marguerite Wilson and Frances Lovelady were across the aisle. We would have all day to recall our fun at East. On further observation we found that Arthur Gregory, now a *Banner* reporter, and Guilford Shearon, also a reporter, were in Section 2 and that Dorothy Parham and her husband, Thomas Corlew, who dabbled in local politics, were in Section 4. As we pulled out I could see Thomas' crony, Tom Naive, also a local politician, who, according to tradition, kissed the children and flattered their parents. The former Evelyn McKinney, his wife, was tugging on his arm to make him leave.

We knew we were in capable hands, for the train was engineered by an old classmate, Charles Andrews. Back in the club car over the radio came the "Krunchy-Krisp Breakfast Food" program, featuring the Cannon sisters, Vera and Uva. Those present were very proud of our twins' success. Albert Rich, a link in the A & P chain stores, asked everybody to be quiet while he read us an account of our own Curtis Manor, legislator of the state of Tennessee, in the *Nashville Banner*, of which William Early was the editor. Mrs. Ernest Lunsford, the former Evelyn Christmas, took advantage of our attention and read us an article in the *Good Housekeeping* magazine written by Alma Wehby and illustrated by Gladys Gibson, both members of our class.

At the suggestion of Lila Womack, a dietitian at Ward-Belmont, we all went to the dining car. On the way we passed the conductor, who was Marvin Hudson. It seemed that our classmates were scattered everywhere. In the dining car we ran across Nancy Peach, Eugenia Hughes, Dorothy Biles, and Marjorie Locke who were all happily married and who seemed to be enjoying the trip very much. At another table I spied Mary Etta Martin, Ermine Maddux, and Anna Belle Callis eating contentedly.

Soon after lunch, our train pulled into Cincinnati where we welcomed Edith and Tud aboard. With them were another member of Tud's professional football team, Robert Hulme, and its manager, Vaughn Hoover. We later discovered that Ann Benson and June Bicket, drum majors with the Ohio State Band, led by Robert Bennett, had also come on board the train at Cincinnati. As the train pulled out we waved to Ira Trotter and Mrs. Trotter, Thelma Butts, who were not able to go with us. Ira owns the Trotter Bus Line that runs in and out of Cincinnati.

As the train sped on to New York we found many more old pals aboard. In Pullman car, "Lakeview," we ran across Orcelia Lankford, Edna Ogles, and Luvena Wilder, the well-known trio on the General Motors program, who got on the train at Miami, where they had been on a vacation. As usual we stopped to talk and found that Orcelia was leaving the trio the

next month to marry Billy Fletcher, an announcer on CBS, and that they were training Ethel Hickcox to take her place. They said that Nancy Edwards was living in Miami and teaching dancing there.

Down the aisle we could hear Dorothy Fulcher talking to someone and we moved on down to see who it was. It proved to be three others, Patricia Hiatt, Elaine Carey, and Sarah Crafton, who were earnestly engaged in a bridge game.

The people in the next car were enjoying themselves immensely with the radio playing in one end and a quartet composed of Howard Allen, Phillip May, Allen Gwinn, and Fred Ammons ringing in the other. They were being led by George Harding, the well-known aviator at Berry Field. The quartet stopped the mournful sound to call a hello to us. George presented his bride of a few months, Frances Glover, and congratulations followed. This car was full of old East graduates, Van Slack and Mrs. Slack, Frances Hardcastle, and Louise Hackney, the poet, and her secretary, Lila Merrit, Douglas Brantley and Thomas Goodwin, lumbermen from out west. Before we knew it, we had arrived at Cleveland.

No sooner had some of us stepped off the Pullman for a little rest, than we spotted James Savage and his brother, Tom, who own a group of ice cream places in Cincinnati. Inside the station we ran into Sarah Hanna and her husband, Jack Jamison, who works at the bank in that city. They were preparing to board the train with another couple, Howard Kirk and Mrs. Kirk, who was Mildred Kelley. The loud-speaker system started calling us aboard.

At dinnertime we made another trip to the dining car where we saw Mildred Pendergrass and Gladys Plummer for the first time. We were soon joined at their table by James McCreary, who has been "courting" Gladys for years. I had such a good time that I was sorry to have that meal come to an end.

After dinner as many as could get in went to the club car. I saw Mary Wallenbrock, the dietitian at a hospital in Atlanta and Emma Tucker, who was teaching school in the same city. They told me many amusing experiences that they had had in the past six years. Later, Evelyn Wray and her husband, Neece Richardson, completed our party.

As we neared New York City the next morning we could see that famous skyline. I discovered that Mr. and Mrs. Ray Petty (Dorothy Walker) who had been honeymooning at Buffalo had got on during the night and through my sleep-fogged mind I welcomed them warmly.

When our train pulled into Grand Central Station, it seemed that the whole '40 class of East were getting off, when in reality there were many more yet to be seen. Loraze and Bob were there to meet us. With them were our own Mac Martin, the sensational tap dancer on the New York stage and his equally nimble wife, the former Nancy Riley, who sometimes performs with him. Here our large party split and went to different hotels. At the Ritz-Carlton, where our group, splurging a little, registered, we saw the names of Betty Jane Faulkner, the famous concert singer and her accompanist, Mary Ruth Crowder, who were guests there. I also noted that Phillip Cole, the Hollywood dress designer and his wife, Elsie Brown, the current rage of the silver screen, were registered. Further down the list I saw three Smiths. The first read Allen Smith and wife; the second, Wm. Maynard Smith; and the third, Paul Smith. I remembered that Allen and Donna (Gilliam) were from St. Louis and that Maynard was now a photographer in Chicago. He had become famous by his photograph of Mildred Corder, the singer, with Frank Stratton's Orchestra. Paul, I heard, was happily married to my old friend, Lucile Buck. Just then I was so glad to see Virginia Alessio and Billy Jernigan. Virginia told me that she and Velma Brann were dress designers for a large department store in New York City. Billy, I discovered, was a floorwalker in the same store. My, but it seemed that everybody came in at once. I could see Luella Allen, Alberta Bowers, and Margaret Clinard coming toward us. They were all working in New York and had come to see us arrive.

Over the radio, as we rested in our rooms, came the voices of the famous comedian, Buck Woodroof, and his assistant, Avonne Wright, who had just recently received the *Radio Guide's* award for service to radio. We laughed at the program, remembering Buck and Avonne in the good old days. Guest artist on the program was an old classmate, Mary Jane Hudson, whose latest book had been the best seller for 1945.

Our program was interrupted by the telephone. It proved to be the desk calling to say that a Miss Evelyn Scruggs and a Mr. Barry Dunlavy were on the way up. In her last letter, Evelyn had said that she and Barry, who was now the professional tennis champion selected to play for the cup next year, were engaged. His partner, Ed Lehning, was to be best man in the wedding. We were very glad to see them and spent a good hour recalling our school days. Evelyn said that Jean Price was doing well in New York as a photographer's model and that Evelyn Rucker was coming up in a few weeks to try her hand at the business. Barry had just returned from South America where a tennis match had taken place. He had stayed with Aaron Brown and his wife Mary Hesson, who own a ranch there and are getting quite rich. He said he was surprised to see Edward Raggett, the well-known baritone, on tour in South America. I also learned that Corinne Taylor and Jean Hewitt were in the women's tennis tournament.

Again, we were interrupted by the telephone. This time it was Lonnie Martin, manager for Jimmy Kent's Revue which was opening in New York City that night. He told us that Jimmy was sending tickets for the performance. We thanked him and resumed our babbling.

That night we took a cab to the revue. As we arrived, we could see that the theatre was an imitation of a Hollywood premiere and that the NBC announcer, Sam Ray, was introducing the celebrities to the radio audience as they arrived. As we alighted we saw that the latest screen sensation, Robert Ponders, was arriving amid a throng of autograph seekers. His constant companion, James Morgan, was behind him. This was all very thrilling to us so we stopped to watch. As they moved on, the spot picked up Connie McEwen, the star of the

revue, and her leading man, Kenneth Thomas. It did us good to see that so many of our classmates had made a success.

As it was nearly time for the show to begin, we hurried in. Jimmy met us at the door and took us to our seats. He left us with his wife, Margaret Bauman, who introduced us to some of their friends. Just then the master of ceremonies, Herman Perry, announced the first act, which was a wrestling bout between Maurice Karr, the champion, and A. W. Owen, refereed by Jack Odom. Knowing very little about such things, I never knew who won. The next thing on the program was a ballet number in which I saw several that I knew, Virginia Allen, Levonia Atkinson, Alyce Comstock, Elizabeth Hampton, and Evelyn Duncan. The star of this was our own Christine Gwaltney, who danced on her toes. We enjoyed this very much.

During a short intermission in the lobby we saw Juanita Crump and her husband, Paul Cartwright, who told us that they were living in St. Paul, Minnesota, where Paul was an architect. They said that James Herod and his wife, Mary Elizabeth Brassell, were also in St. Paul. During the intermission we saw Ruby Crawford and Pearl Bradford, too, who said that they had come on an earlier train to do some shopping for Pearl's wedding which would be soon. The prospective bridegroom was John Stedelin.

It was time to go back to our seats as the second act was about to begin. Herman announced that the next would be Robert Leftwich, the great magician, assisted by Jimmy Gribble and Elizabeth Allen. This part was very good although rather hard on the nervous system. An acrobatic number followed, starring Gertrude Almquist, Ruth Beasley, and Geneva Webster. Their teacher, Roy Williams, beamed on them from the wing. Their real ability called for many encores.

Letcher Murphy and his orchestra then played several of the latest song hits, one of which was sung by Marjorie Helen Dobie.

The last act with Connie and Kenneth doing a ballroom solo followed by a group of girls in an exhibition waltz was splendid. Again I saw some girls that I knew. On the right were Gloria Park, Janelle Melton, and Mozelle McGowan; on the left, Margaret Wright, Lois McCord, and Juanita Pennington. After a very enjoyable evening, we all went sound asleep with fatigue.

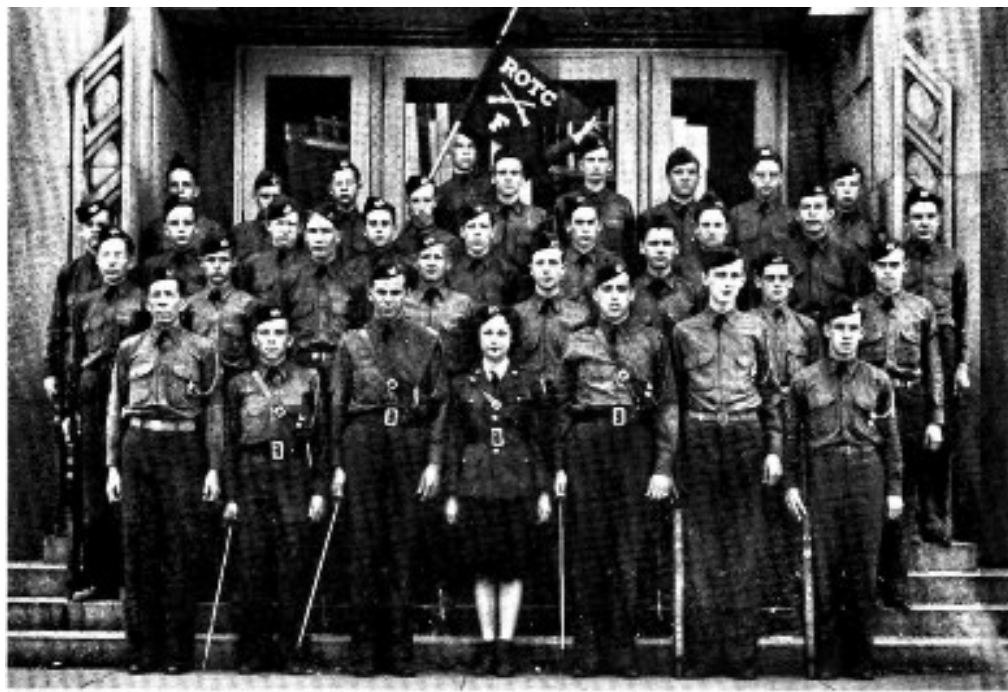
The next morning dawned clear and warm and we dressed to go to the church. After many last-minute details, we got off and arrived twenty minutes early (imagine that!). As we walked in we could hear the loud peal of the organ which I knew was being played by my old friend, Mary Sue Warren, and the voice of Elizabeth Wehrenberg. A male soloist sang, and I afterwards learned it was Neil Lancaster. I saw him and his wife, the former Pauline Sutton, at the reception after the wedding. Then I saw Anna Belle Buck and Hazel Davis walk in on the arm of Bill Webster, who was ushering. They were followed by Elinor Gilbert and her husband, James Gregory, and Elizabeth Herbert and her fiance, Robert Caughey. I could see Nannie Sue Wright, Dorothy Waldrip, and Vida Uselton in the pew in front of us. I heard that they were now going to art school in New York. Just then David Adams, the other usher, brought Mr. and Mrs. Harry Binkley (the former Mary Fuller) down the side aisle.

The organ began playing the "Wedding March" and the minister, Dr. Robert Hedrick, appeared at the altar. I could see Bob and his best man, David Brown, at the altar, also. Down the aisle came a little boy of about three years of age bearing the ring. I later found out that he was Kelly Clements, III, son of Charlotte (Dunwoody) and Kelly. I also discovered that the little flower girl was the daughter of Lillian Hendricks and Jack Carson. The bridesmaids, Mildred Williams, Helen Woodall, Mary Catherine Sanders, and Dorothy Skeggs marched slowly, one by one, down the aisle. The maid of honor, Glennara Clark, followed and then came Loraze in a beautiful white dress and veil.

The lovely ceremony brought tears to my eyes and I felt glad that I had come to see it. My dreamy look was soon gone for Ruth pushed me into a cab. She wanted to get to the reception at the hotel early, no doubt. She probably wanted to see more old friends and her wish was rewarded for we met Arlene Pelton, the Olympic swimmer, and her best friend, Sarah Jones, coming into the lobby. While we were talking, a puzzled-looking couple asked if we knew where a wedding reception was to be held in the hotel. They turned out to be our old friends, Bill Bryan and his wife, Mary Louise Howell. We moved in a body to the reception room and there saw Billy Sanders, the talented young musician, James Martin, who is now selling washing machines; and the typical Fuller Brush man, Ray Busby. They were busy jabbering with the comedienne, Natalie Rhea, and her secretary, Kate Hunt. They seemed to be having such a good time that I merely waved to them and moved over to a group made up of promising young lawyers, Albert Kirkpatrick and George Griffin and their wives, Thelma Sullivan and Virginia Tucker. Claude Chery, also a lawyer and a gay young bachelor, was a member of this group. Our talk was interrupted by the entrance (on crutches) of Jennie Van Nabors, the famous horsewoman. I remembered that she had been hurt in a fall a month or two before. Mary Ellen Jakes and her husband, Wallace Riggins, the oil man, entered directly behind her. Everyone gathered to speak to them only to scatter as the bride and groom came in. A happy hour followed in which we teased the newlyweds and recalled old times. The late arrivals, Dr. Evan Davenport and Dr. Joseph Earhart, were warmly welcomed.

Four very tired girls made their way to Grand Central Station that afternoon for the trip home. As we started down the passageway to the southbound train we met Ewin Miller coming out. To his dismay he soon discovered that he was exactly six hours too late for the wedding. But turn around? He would not. He said that since he was as close to New York City as that, he would "see the sights" before he returned.

As the train pulled out of New York, my eyes closed with weariness and my mind wandered back over the happy two days I had just spent with all my classmates of the 1940 class of East Nashville High School. I wondered if ever we would all meet again.

The Duncan surname is one of the oldest and most distinguished names of Scottish origin, rooted in the Gaelic *Donnchadh*, meaning “brown warrior” or “dark-haired chief.” The name was borne by early Scottish kings and clan leaders, and Duncan families were firmly established in the Scottish Highlands by the medieval period.

Many Duncan lines came to America during the eighteenth century, particularly through the great waves of Scottish and Scots-Irish migration that followed political unrest, economic pressure, and the aftermath of events such as the Jacobite uprisings. These immigrants typically entered through colonial ports in Virginia and the Carolinas before moving inland along the Appalachian frontier. By the late 1700s and early 1800s, Duncan families were well established across South Carolina, North Carolina, and Georgia, later pushing westward into Alabama and Tennessee as new land opened.

This migration pattern aligns closely with the Duncan family’s presence in South Carolina and Pickens County, Alabama, as seen in the life of William Lyles Duncan (1826–1900). By the nineteenth century, the Duncan family had become fully integrated into American society, often appearing as landowners, farmers, community leaders, and professionals. Their steady westward movement, generational continuity, and long presence in the southern United States reflect a classic colonial-descendant lineage rather than a later immigrant family, firmly rooted in the early settlement and expansion of America.

The earliest clearly documented Duncan arrival in America is **William Duncan**, whose name appears in **Virginia colonial records before 1680**, establishing him as one of the first known Duncan settlers in the New World. Although no surviving passenger list records his voyage, his presence in court actions, land deeds, tax lists, and other legal documents of early Virginia confirms that he had already arrived by the time these records were created.

Additional Duncan names appear shortly thereafter in **Maryland, Pennsylvania, and North Carolina**, reflecting the broader pattern of **Scottish and Scots-Irish (Ulster Scots) migration** during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. These settlers entered the colonies in significant numbers due to political instability, economic pressure, and religious change in Scotland and Ulster.

The documentary evidence for early Duncan settlement is drawn primarily from Virginia colonial records predating 1680, as well as court and land records throughout the Tidewater and Piedmont regions, which together establish the Duncan family as part of America’s early colonial population.

George S. Youngblood On the morning of April 26th, 1923, George S. Youngblood passed peacefully into the great beyond, after several weeks of suffering which he bore with that characteristic fortitude of a hopeful Christian.

He was born near Andrew Chapel Church, Pickens County, Alabama, in 1852. He followed farming as a vocation until young manhood. He received the best education possible for his day and opportunity, and as a teacher for several years, he was recognized as one of the best educators of his county.

At an early age he was married to Miss Nannie Lawrence, who preceded him to the grave a few years, having died December 16th, 1918. From this union came sons and daughters whose lives are reflecting the beautiful characteristics of their parents to the glory of God and the helpfulness of mankind. The deceased was a great factor in the development of his community, county and state, socially, economically, morally and educationally. In 1892 he was elected representative from his county to the state legislature, and he served another term in 1915. He was appointed tax adjuster for his county in 1919, a position he held to the day of his death.

At the time of his death, he was the superintendent of the Andrew Chapel Sunday School, a position he had held for more than thirty years. Being a positive Christian, a conscientious public servant, and a devout church worker, Brother Youngblood commanded the love and respect of all.

He was a pioneer Methodist. He was among the founders and early promoters of the Andrew Chapel campground which has been running for God's glory for more than fifty years.

A truer man never lived than George S. Youngblood. He loved his Church. He was a friend indeed to the preachers. He held his friends by mere power of acquaintance plus an unquestionable life. Members of all other denominations as well as non-professing people honored, loved and confided in him. People everywhere he went were forced to take "knowledge of him that he had been with Jesus."

Many will be the number of his children, his grandchildren and relatives, and friends of all ages around old Andrew Chapel who will rise up in the great day of accounts and call him blessed for having led them to Jesus Christ.

He always stood square on all moral and social questions as well as all other considerations. He allowed his conscience to dictate regardless of popularity or policy. He was truly a man led by strong convictions for the right against the wrong.

He was, nevertheless, kind, considerate, and gentle. Whenever or wherever sickness, sorrow, or distress were found, he was ever ready to comfort and help.

He died at his home in Carrollton, the dying couch being surrounded by loved ones and sympathizing friends. He is survived by two sons and eight daughters. These are they: T. W. Youngblood and J. B. Youngblood of Ethelsville; Mrs. Ella Hinton of Aliceville; Mrs. J. H. Duncan of Ethelsville; Mrs. Anna Shelton and Mrs. J. L. Smith of Pine Hill; Mrs. D. M. Lacy of Millport; Mrs. W. E. Redus of Columbus, Miss.; Mrs. C. C. Hudson and Miss Mary Youngblood of Carrollton. These with a host of other relatives and friends mourn his departure.

He had finished his work. He had truly fought the good fight of faith as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. A good man, a Christian gentleman, a model husband, a devoted father, a loyal, public-spirited citizen, a conscientious and praiseworthy county and state official, he loved his life as well and his works do follow him. Truly it may be said again: "A great man and a prince is fallen in Israel."

In the Andrew Chapel Tabernacle, the Church of his entire life, his funeral was conducted by his pastor, assisted by W. E. Draper, W. A. Mays and J. W. Dowle; and in the cemetery there, in the presence of a great assembly of relatives and friends, his weary form was laid to rest to await the resurrection of the just.

Robert Lawrence, son of Sir John Lawrence, merchant of London, appears to be the first of this family in Virginia. He obtained a patent of 100 acres of land on Lawne's Creek, Isle of Wight, and another one of 200 acres "adjacent to the widow Bennett and Mr. Hardy, August 25, 1642". He was a Justice for the County of Nansemond in 1659-60. His wife was named Elizabeth. (17th C. 491).

Children:

I. Robert Lawrence, Jr., born 1639. It appears that he married Mrs. Jane Gay, widow of Henry Gay. He was granted 625 acres of land on the west side of the Chowanoke River, in North Carolina, in 1663, thus becoming one of the first Virginia settlers to migrate to North Carolina. However, he returned to Virginia and made his will, Isle of Wight, April 20, 1720, which is only partially preserved. All names are missing from the will except that of Robert Lawrence, III, and son-in-law Henry Gay, son of Mrs. Jane Gay. (Great Book 2, p. 59)

1. Robert Lawrence, III, m. his cousin Sarah Exum, daughter of Jeremiah and Ann Lawrence Exum.

- (1) Jeremiah Lawrence, made his will in Isle of Wight, where he died unmarried in 1756. (W. B. 6, p. 246)

 - b. Robert, V., m. Sarah Eley, daughter of Robert and Cherry Eley, March 23, 1786;

(6) A daughter, m. Jacob Darden II, and left two children, Jacob and Charles Darden.

II. George Lawrence received a patent of 120 acres on Western Branch of Nansemond, July 10, 1680. He also received a patent of 830 acres on the Blackwater in Nansemond for the transportation of 13 persons, and the record shows he owned 400 acres in Nansemond in 1704. The Nansemond fire destroyed further record of this family. (17th Cent. 492)

III. Henry Lawrence made his home in Nansemond County. His wife's name is unknown. He had two sons, Michael and Thomas. His daughter, Isabella, m. Thomas Page, son of Thomas Page, of Isle of Wight, January 15, 1702, at the home of Frances Denson, widow. Rebecca Page, daughter of Thomas Page, married Thomas Gay, son of Mrs. Jane Gay Lawrence, November 11, 1699/1700. (17th Cent. 493)

IV. John Lawrence, I, patented 625 acres of land on the west side of the Chowanoke River, in North Carolina, next to his older brother, Robert Lawrence, September 25, 1663. He made his will in Nansemond County, January 2, 1696. His wife, Mary, signed her name at Quaker Meetings as "Mary Lawrence, Widow", after 1700. (17th Cent. 494)

1. Priscilla Lawrence, m. Matthew Whitfield, of Nansemond County, and moved to Bertie County, North Carolina.
2. Mary Lawrence, m. John Thomas, of Nansemond County. She was his second wife. His first wife may have been the daughter of Michael Rogers, of Isle of Wight, who made his will April 5, 1710. John Thomas moved to Bertie County, North Carolina, where he made a deed to Colonel Thomas Pollock of 208 acres of land on the west side of Chowan River, "right to said land by my now wife, daughter of John Lawrence, deceased". 4. Ann Lawrence, m. Jeremiah Exum, who was one of the Justices of the County Court of Isle of Wight in 1693-94. He made his will September 3, 1712, and died in 1720. (Great Book 2, p. 21) Ann Lawrence Exum made her will, Isle of Wight, February 3, 1726/27 and it was recorded March 27, 1727. (W.B. 3, p. 19).

- (2) Mary, m. (1) Jacob Ricks (Southside II, p. 295) and m. Sarah Holladay was the daughter of Anthony and Mrs. Ann Brewer Holladay. John Lawrence made his will in Newport Parish, January 27, 1738, and it was recorded April 23, 1739. (W.B. 4, p. 226). Margaret Murphy Lawrence made her will in the same county September 26, 1746, and same was recorded February 7, 1750 (W.B. 5, p. 296).

My Favorite Ancestor

DR. ARCHIBALD BIGBIE SPRUILL

GRACE H. SPRUILL COOK

Dr. Archibald Bigbie Spruill came to Jackson County, Missouri, with his family in 1868 from Pickens County, Alabama, the place of his birth. The Civil War had left the land with little value; all but a few of the slaves had gone, and the way of life in Alabama was no longer the gentle life it had been.

Archibald Bigbie Spruill, born 11 Jun 1824, was the eldest son of Thomas Wesley and Margaret Ann (Peggy) Bigbie Spruill, both from Abbeville County, South Carolina. The two family names are mentioned in Virginia in the late 1600s; then in eastern North Carolina as their families followed in the same pattern of migration. There were nine families who moved from Abbeville County, South Carolina, in the early 1800s with the Spruill family, some going no further than Georgia--the others continuing on to Alabama.

When Archibald Spruill was nineteen years of age, he went to live in the household of his uncle, Dr. Jephtha Spruill, also of Pickens County, to assist him and to acquaint himself with the duties of a physician. Dr. Jephtha Spruill was a prominent physician and citizen in that area; he also served several terms in the State Legislature of Alabama. Following this period of service with his uncle, Archibald attended medical college at Augusta, Georgia, graduating in 1846. He then returned to Pickens County, Alabama, where he practiced medicine for the next twenty years.

On the 4 Feb 1851, he and Martha Elizabeth Bonner, daughter of James Bonner, were married. After his marriage, Dr. Spruill added the management of his plantation to his professional duties. He followed the example of his Uncle Jephtha and became active in politics in the Whig Party. He was deeply conservative in his sentiments, and was dismayed at the attempts to disrupt the Union of the States, and steadfastly opposed secession of his state from the National Government. After the rebellion was actually inaugurated, however, his sympathies were with his native state and the South. He did all in his power to aid the Confederate cause, though he personally took no active part in the struggle. One family records that Coxton's Army, a part of Grant's, burned Tuscaloosa and moved Westward into Mississippi, pilaging and looting the plantations throughout Pickens County.

After the war was over and so much had been suffered and lost, Dr. Spruill determined to move his wife and family of six children from Alabama. In 1866 they journeyed to Trenton, Tennessee, where a sister of Dr. Spruill's and her husband lived; Permelia Antoinette and Captain Sidney E. Thomas, with whom his mother made her home - his father having passed in 1860. Here twin daughters were born.

In 1868 the family continued its journey to Jackson County, Missouri, settling on 400-acres known as the Chiles farm in the neighborhood of New Santa Fe. One son was born in Missouri, Emmett Archibald, in 1871 from whom my husband's line of the family is descended.

Dr. Spruill continued to practice his profession and to engage in farming. He also maintained an active interest in politics. Beginning in 1874 he served two terms as a representative in the Missouri Legislature. An article in the 1877 Jackson County Atlas implies that he was a candidate for office at that time. The article also states that in the spring of 1877, Dr. Spruill moved his family to Kansas City. The home was located near 17th and Summit on Drip Street.

There is an interesting but very sad story told about Martha Elizabeth Bonner Spruill, the doctor's wife. When she received her inheritance from her father in the 1850s, she invested the money in additional slaves. When the Civil War was over, of course, the slaves were free to leave; only a few stayed on with the family.

After the family had settled in Missouri, Martha's unmarried brother, Tom Bonner, wanted to do something to replace her lost inheritance. He gave her a farm on the Kansas side of State line; a large farm, I am told, west of what is now 95th Street to 103rd Street. Martha's two sons, Thomas Jephtha, and John William, who was a doctor, were given charge of the farm. They went on a cattle drive to bring stock back for the farm and they planted crops. In August 1879, Annie Laura, then seventeen years old, joined the boys on the farm to cook for them during the harvest season. The water in the well was contaminated, and within a week's time all three of these young family members were dead. They are buried in the old Elmwood Cemetery.

What grief Martha suffered from her inheritance! Not once, but twice she was hurt by this gift, and so severely with the loss of three children. She was a little Southern lady and in the only picture we have of her, she is dressed in black taffeta and is wearing a little black taffeta bonnet-like hat tied under her chin; very prim and dear.

Dr. Spruill was a tall straight gentleman with a neatly trimmed beard, high forehead and piercing eyes with a kindly expression. It was the custom in the 1880s for people who lived in the country to drive a horse and buggy into Westport and from there ride the "mule car" to the downtown area. Dr. Spruill slipped and fell as he boarded the trolley car, and broke his hip. At that time the best treatment known for a broken hip was to keep the patient flat on his back and very often pneumonia set in, which is what happened and to which the good doctor succumbed in September of 1889.

I remember the lovely old family farm home that stood off Wornall Road at 120th Street. I especially remember the beautiful walnut stairway that circled into the entrance hall. It was here that Emmett A. Spruill and Lillie B. Amidon were married on December 15, 1897. Lillie was the daughter of Madison and Sarah Amidon, who had a farm on the Blue River not too far from the Spruill property. Her father was known as the "Frenchman" in this part of the country. He was descended from a French Huguenot family that came to America in 1637. Another story.

In the living room of the lovely old home on Wornall Road was a huge fireplace used to keep the downstairs area warm. They had a colored boy named "Toad" whose job it was to keep the fire going. He slept on a pallet beside the fireplace during the cold weather and added logs as needed throughout the night.

Lottie was a trusted and much loved "Mammy" who cared for the family members. There were a number of these people who were "special" to the family and the Spruills had a house in back of the farm home for them. They are also buried in the Old Douglas Cemetery off Holmes Road.

My husband, William Kenneth Spruill, the third son of Emmett and Lillie Spruill, and I, Grace Hare, were married 7 May 1932 at the Broadway Methodist Church. We had three children:

William K. Spruill, Jr., now living in Springfield, Oregon, and he has some of the tools Dr. A. B. Spruill used in his profession. William has two sons to carry on the Spruill name, Mark K. Spruill, who has a degree in architecture from Oregon University in Eugene, and who is presently in Alaska; and G. Scott Spruill, who is a sports journalists living in Renton, WA. Scott has made three trips to China and Korea with the International Sports Exchange and also publishes a book each year which is filled with sports statistics pertaining to Washington high school and college athletes.

Gary J. Spruill and his wife, live in Kansas City. They have two children, Michael K. Spruill, who was co-captain of his football team at Missouri Western during his senior year there and is now with the Navy in Norfolk, VA. Michael reports there are two pages of Spruills listed in the Norfolk telephone directory, and they are often asked if they are related to "so and so." (The first Spruill in America came to Jamestown County and later settled in 1697 in Tyrrell County, NC). Deborah Spruill Krabeil lives in Raytown with her husband, Mark. She is employed in the accounting department of an engineering firm.

Barbara Spruill McAnany and her husband live in Longwood, FL. They have three children, Heather, Kimberlyn, and Peterjon.

Dr. Jephtha Spruill succeeded Dr. King at the August election of 1844, the latter having voluntarily retired from political life. Like his predecessors, he has been so prominent a man in this county, that his biography cannot be dispatched in a brief paragraph. He was born in Abbeville District, South Carolina, in the year 1808, and emigrated to this country with his father, the late George C. Spruill, in 1820, settling, first, some nine miles south of Columbus, in what was then called Mississippi Territory.—He is one of six sons and four daughters. The family removed to Pickens in 1825, and settled in the northern portion of the county on McBees creek. He was educated in part. at Columbus, under the Rev. David Wright, a Presbyterian

minister, varying his scholastic pursuits between the duties of pupil and teacher, himself, resorting to the latter as a means of defraying his expenses.

In 1830, Dr. Spruill being then twenty two years of age, visited the State of Kentucky, and there took up his residence for a time with D. David McFall of Paris, Bourbon county, and during portions of the years 1830-'31 and 1832, attended the lectures of the Transylvania University. In the summer of 1831, he returned to Alabama and practiced medicine as copartner of Dr. Richardson Owen, keeping their office at Carrollton, in the counting-room of the store now occupied by Wilson & Mustin, but a year or two later, became located in the neighborhood of his father on McBees creek, where he steadily pursued his profession for several years.

In 1836, Dr. Spruill married the daughter of James Bonner, and soon after settled near Bonner's Mill, in Pickens, where he remained about five years before he removed to the plantation where he now resides. It is some two miles from Dr. King's well known residence, so that he was the neighbor of his senatorial predecessor for many years, and Pickens county was, for nine consecutive years, represented by two gentlemen living on adjoining plantations. It is a beautiful spot, situated six miles east from Pickensville, and about the same distance from Carrollton. The Doctor continued the practice of his profession with unabated energy until 1852, and then retired from it with more than ordinary success, both as a physician and as a means of acquiring property, having had an extensive practice for over twenty years.

In 1834, Dr. Spruill was a candidate for the legislature on the nullification ticket and was defeated by a large majority.

In 1836, Dr. Spruill volunteered as a common soldier for the Florida war, but was employed professionally most of the time during the several months he was with the army. The division in which he served, was commanded by General Lindsay, Gen'l Crabb, of Tuscaloosa, being Lieut. Colonel, and the late Joseph Martin of Pickens, spoken of above among the list of Representatives, being Captain of Dr. Spruill's company, from Pickens county. The Doctor saw some hard soldiering in those few months. He was with the forces sent from Tampa Bay across the Peninsula to meet General Scott's division from the East, but failing to meet Scott, and being detained some time at Fort Chisolm, their provisions gave out, and it is probable that the Doctor could give a sad tale of famine, hunger and the usual resorts in such cases, to the most revolting food, and also, a story of

Indian treachery, and of poor soldiers dying of hunger fatigue and sickness. In this march, died Winter, of Tuscaloosa.

The South Carolina regiment had left many sick at Tampa Bay, without medical aid, and here Dr. Spruill found them, far from home, in an enemy's country, and his sympathies were aroused for these brothers of his own native South Carolina, and he volunteered to attend them, receiving an appointment to do so from General Scott himself. He found it a position of great care and responsibility, besides great labor and fatigue, causing him many a sleepless night!

In 1837, Dr. Spruill was, for the first time, a member of the Legislature. He was again a member of the House in 1840-'41, also in 1841-'42 and in 1843-'44, being thus elected to four Legislatures and never beaten after the first trial before the people on the question of nullification. He took a very active and prominent part upon the floor of the House on several important occasions, particularly, during the called sessions of 1837 and 1841. He obtained considerable notoriety in the session of 1837 by his long speech, protracted through a day and a night with a view to stave off the election of United States Senator, until certain members could obtain instructions from their constituents, on that occasion, evincing great ability as a debator, and as a skillful tactician in foiling his political adversaries. Indeed, the Doctor obtained a celebrity over the State by his effort on this occasion, and demonstrated a power and ability as an orator, and debator which could have been cultivated to a degree to cope fully with the most able and powerful.

In 1844, Dr. Spruill retired, voluntarilly without consultation with, and against the wishes of his numerous friends and admirers. He was then earnestly solicited to run for re-election, and has since been frequently urged to become a candidate for office. He has been spoken of for Congress in other counties than Pickens, but he resists, as yet, all these importunities, and remains inflexibly determined to continue to enjoy the sweets of domestic life, and to avoid the perplexities of political warfare. He writes himself down, politically, at the present time as "a decided native American—formerly a most notorious whig." His age is about forty-eight, tall and erect in person, rather fleshy and would weigh at least one hundred and eighty pounds! He has three sons and three daughters. His lady is an intelligent woman, and what is as valuable an accomplishment, she is a planter's daughter who knows how to make a good, domestic planter's wife, with whom, and his family and friends, her husband, the Doctor, enjoys the full fruition of a Southern planter's life. It may be remarked of Dr. Spruill that, were his ambition as a great as his ability, he would yet

become considerably more distinguished. He seems to feel a disinclination for the strifes of politics, while when once enlisted, he bears himself right valiantly, and pushes his antagonists to the wall with a zest and zeal which looks little like flinching from the fight.

Dr. Spruill's biography might be extended to much greater length. He has been an active and consistent member of the Baptist church for several years.

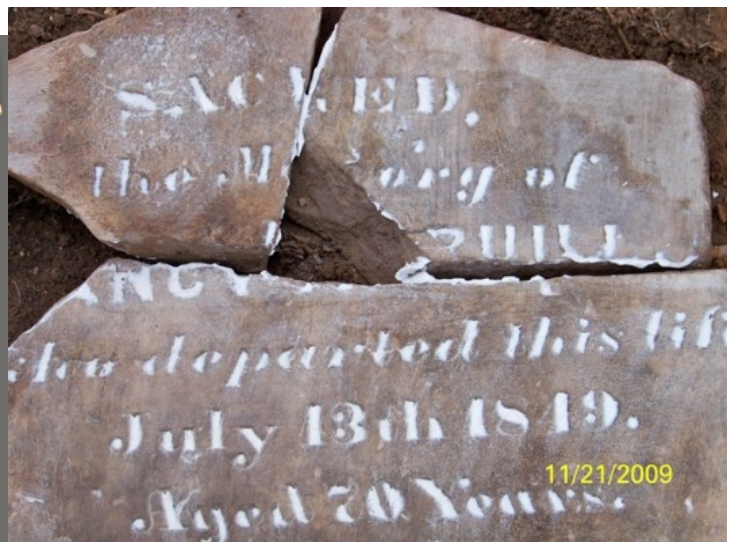

Last Will & Testament

Abbeville District, South Carolina: Will Book 1, Page 496; Dated January 5, 1808 and Recorded; February 2, 1808.

In the Name of God Amen: 25th of January in the year of our Lord 1808. I John Spruill in the District of Abbeville being very sick and weak of body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be giving to God. Knowing that this is appointed for all men once to dye. Do make and ordain this

my last will and testament. This is to say principlly and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner. As as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give divice of the same in the following manner and form, Imprimis, it is my will and I do order that all my just debts be paid and satisfied.

Item: I give and bequeath unto Ruth my Dear beloved wife, all her goods and chattels that she brought onto my premises when we were married also 50 acres of land lying the north side of the creek where I now live, adjoining land belonging to William Lord and the Mitchells during her life or widowhood at which time the said land is to be equally divided between my children.

Item: I give unto my sons Thomas and Gabriel at the end of six years a good horse to each of them, one good feather bed and furniture to each of them and one good cow a piece and what is left of my estate, it is my will that it be sold on a credit of two years and the money equally divided between my twelve (12) children. (viz). William, George, Luke, Simeon, John, Polly, Samuel, Jeptor, Nancy, Sally, Thomas, and Gabriel.

Also it is my will that the lawful heirs of my daughter Peggy should have an equal share of the money that is raised out of my estate with my twelve children, (viz) Her heirs to have 1/13 of my estate. I likewise constitute and appoint my son William and my son-in-law, William Weldon my only and sole executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disanull all and every other former will and executors by me in any wise before this time appointed and witnessed whereof I have set my hand and seal this day and date above written.

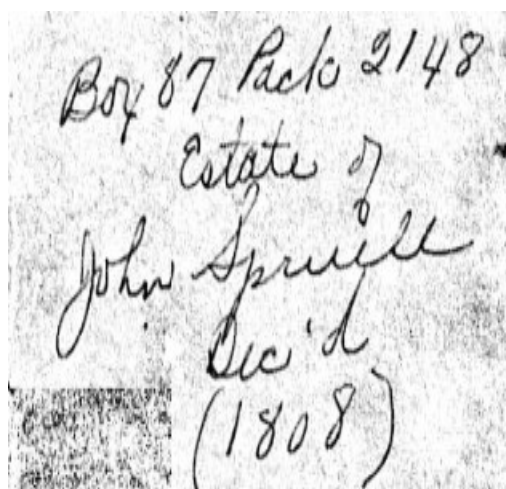
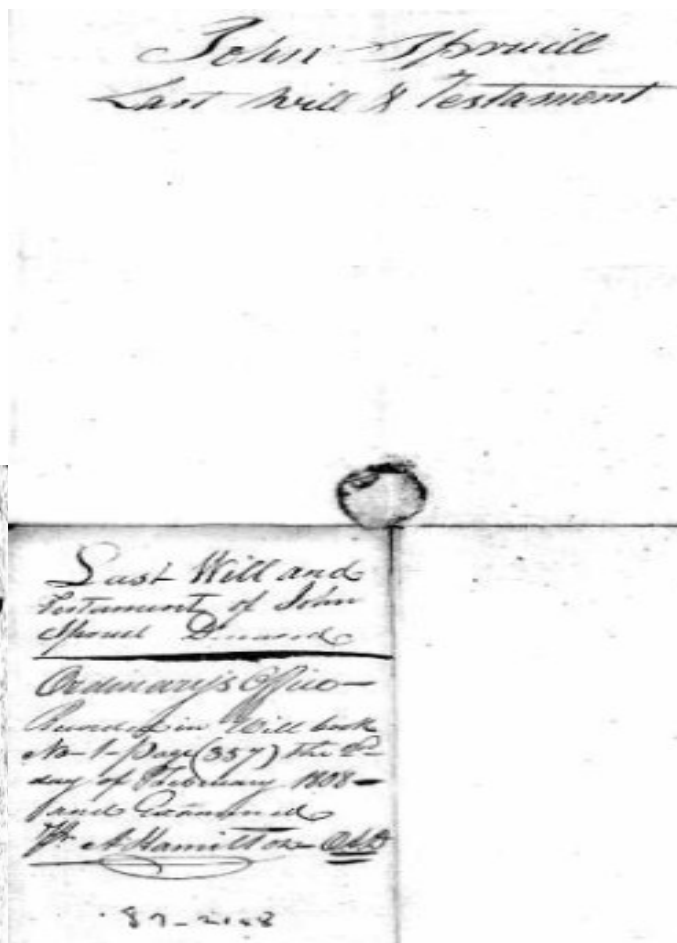

-April 1776 a receipt is written to Col. William Graham of Tryon describing erroneous extension of payment to Thomas Donaldson Jr & Simon Dunn Sgts in Capt. Robert's Company; receipt settled in April in Halifax, NC (implication being they served prior to April with Capt, Porter)

-April 2, 1776 Thomas Donaldson & John Donaldson enlist in SC military on the same day. (SC-NC border is mixed at this time in history.) **Unclear if this is Jr or Sr

-Land confiscation was occurring on Duncan's creek & surrounding area at this time. (In 1796 Patrick Cunningham, a forgiven Loyalist, is given the land for which Thomas Donaldson once held patent, implying that Thomas had lost it sometime around 1784 or before.)

-October-November 1777 Thomas Donaldson Jr is in Robert Porter's company out of Tryon NC

-1778-Thomas Jr's first child is born: Nancy Agnes; presumably in Tryon/Rutherford Co.

-1779 Tryon NC petition for field officer; Thomas Donaldson signature with others

-Dec 1779 Land entered (granted October 1782) for Thomas Donaldson on Cathey's Creek, Rutherford County NC; **It is becoming likely that Thomas Jr bought the land and because of the Loyalist purge in Rutherford, he allowed his father access to land in his own name. Thomas Sr died here in 1792. The land described in this deed is sold in small parcels in 1811 and called 'the Donaldson Tract.' The land is referred to as Donaldson's Fork and Donaldson's Tract still in 1818 land sales. (See The Loyalist father James Cook Sr & Patriot son James Cook Jr stories that are also tied to our Thomas Donaldson.) The land is adjacent to [William Porter's](#) land who bequeathed part of his property to the Brittain Presbyterian Church including 'Donaldson Spring' which is on the property. The described land location can also be found at the base of Donaldson Mountain marked on an old Tryon map you can find in my Ancestry Tree. William Porter signs several documents with Thomas Donaldson Jr & even posts his bail in one instance. Thomas Donaldson seems to be intimately tied to William Porter's family of Rutherford County. **I have more information on the Porter family.

-March-May 1780- Loyalist siege of Charleston

-October 1780 Battle of King's Mountain- It is not believed that Thomas (Jr or Sr) fought in this battle or any of the later battles of the war.

-1780 Thomas's daughter Elizabeth is born.

-1781 Thomas Donaldson Jr Tryon/Rutherford- Appointed Constable to appear before John Flack

-1782 NC/SC/GA line boundaries complete

-1782 Thomas Donaldson on Rutherford County- NC Early Census Index

-1782 Thomas Donaldson vs. Mary Kelly for slander; William Porter posts bail (Rutherford Co)

-1782 Son, [James Donaldson](#) is born

-Sept 1783 Treaty of Paris officially ends Revolutionary War

-1783 Thomas & others petition for field officer in Rutherford County

-1783 Thomas Donaldson Jr signs for James Cook Jr & his wife Catherine in Rutherford Co; witnessed by [Robert Gilkey](#) (Gilkey is William Porter's brother-in-law)

-1784 Thomas Donaldson purchases from the estate sale of John Jones [FATHER](#), Quaker neighbor on Duncan's Creek/Laurens. **UNCLEAR as to whether this is Thomas Sr or Jr.

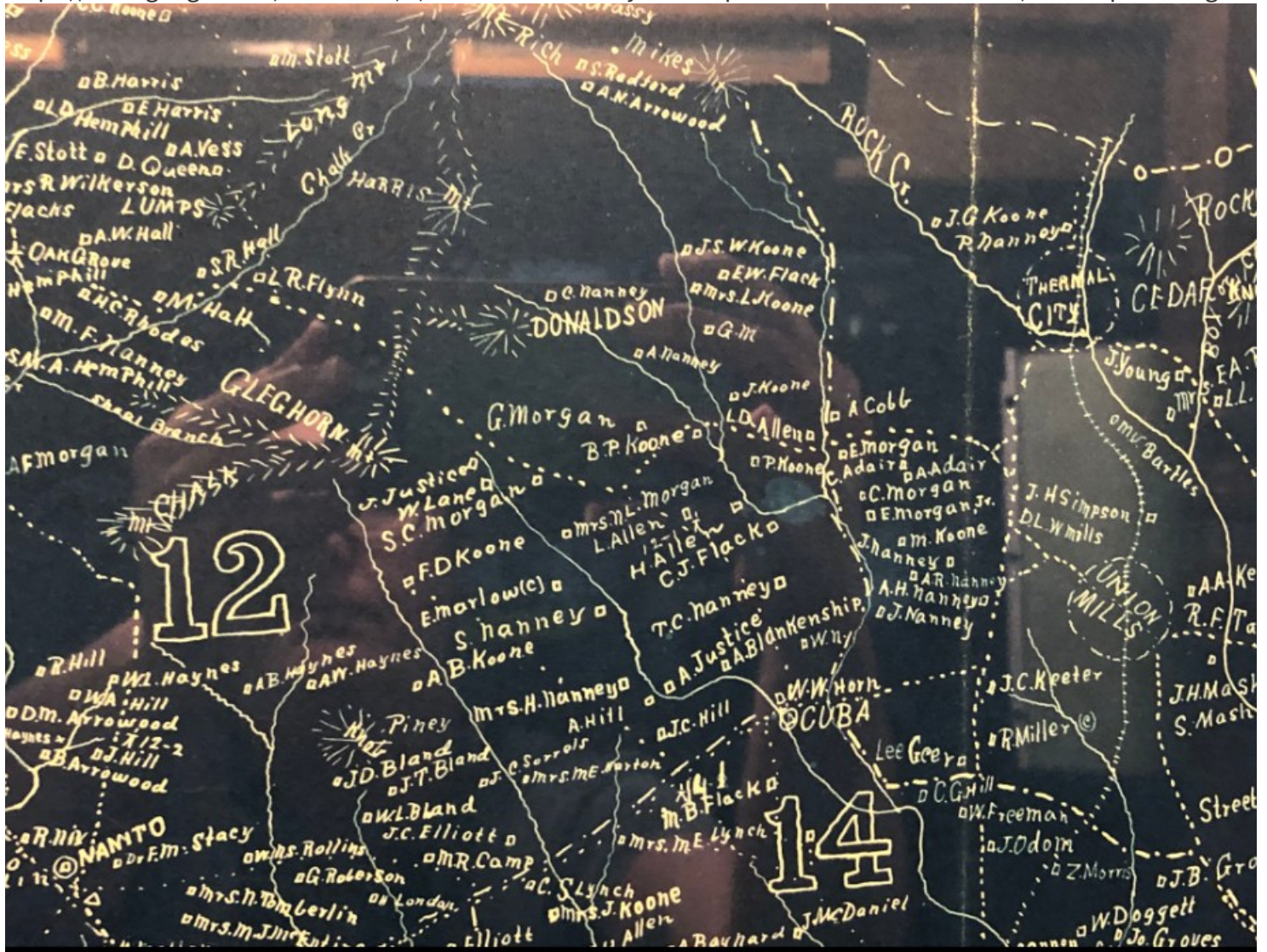

 - 1786 Thomas is "of Abbeville"
 - 1786 Thomas Donaldson "of Abbeville" sells the 1782 land patent on Cathey's Creek Land to John Harris "of Rutherford"
 - 1787 Thomas Donaldson is in Abbeville SC (SC reconstructed records)
 - 1787 Son, Thomas Donaldson III is born
 - ~1790 marriage to Mary Cook in SC
 - 1790 Thomas Donaldson is on Abbeville County Census
 - 1792 His father, [Thomas Sr](#) , dies at Cathey's Creek; Richard Daugherty & wife notify (son-in-law?) See James Dougherty in Laurens County.

 - 1814 Mary Cook Donaldson dies & a lawsuit is brought up against Thomas' estate.
 - 1811- land sales on Cathey's Creek mentioning Donaldson "land, creek, fork," etc. (Presumably as a result of Thomas of Abbeville's probate.)
 - 1818- Land on Cathey's Creek is still described as "Donaldson Fork"

Thomas Donaldson Sr. died in Rutherford County in 1792, somewhere along the middle fork of Cathey's Creek, where he lived "close up under the (Donaldson) mountain". Richard Dougherty and wife Sarah are with him at his death and record his last wishes to have his debts paid, remainder given to his wife, and the bequeathing of a cow to William's daughter Mary "as he'd promised it to her earlier."

Prior to living in Rutherford County, Thomas is known to have lived in Hillsborough, Orange County where at least some of his children are born between 1760 and 1771. Political tensions start to run high, bringing upon the Battle of Alamance in 1771. A Thomas Donaldson can be found on militia rolls, but it is NOT confirmed which Thomas this is as there seems to be at least three men of the same name, all of whom are politically active, living in the area.

A 1768 land petition by Thomas out of Orange County for present-day Laurens County indicates the family's move south and westward. Land documents dated 1774 and 1775 for Thomas Donaldson can be found there, on Duncan's Creek in connection with John Donaldson. Tensions start to run high in the Carolina backcountry at this time, with an unavoidable civil war between neighbors and family choosing to remain loyal to the Crown or to join the building rebellion.

Emboldened by their October seizure of gun powder and ammunition meant for the Cherokee, the Loyalists began to ban in significant numbers in the 96th District by December. The Battle of Great Crane Brake on Dec 22, and the follow up Snow Campaign of Dec 23-30 saw tensions rise further between the Patriots and Loyalists in the area. On February 27, 1776, both sides collided in a significant encounter near Wilmington at the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge. It has been verified that Thomas Sr fought as a Scottish Loyalist, while his son Thomas Jr. fought for the Patriots in this battle. The decisive victory by the Patriots at that battle would set the course of the war with the Americans declaring independence from Brittain a few months later.

It is not clear the exact details of which Thomas and his family move from Laurens, SC to Tryon/Rutherford County, NC, but it is factually evident that there was movement between the two places for the next ten years. Two of Thomas Sr's known sons, William and Thomas Jr both serve as Patriots out of Tryon (Rutherford) and both Thomas Sr and Jr can be found on numerous Tryon/Rutherford court documents in verification of leadership roles within the community.

-1784 Thomas Donaldson purchases from the estate sale of John Jones [FATHER](#) , Quaker neighbor on Duncan's Creek/Laurens. What connection is here if our men were in Rutherford Co? Was Thomas Sr still here until land confiscation?

-1790 Thomas Donaldson is on Rutherford County Census

-1792 Thomas Sr dies at Cathey's Creek; Richard Daugherty & wife notify (son-in-law?) See James Dougherty in Laurens County.

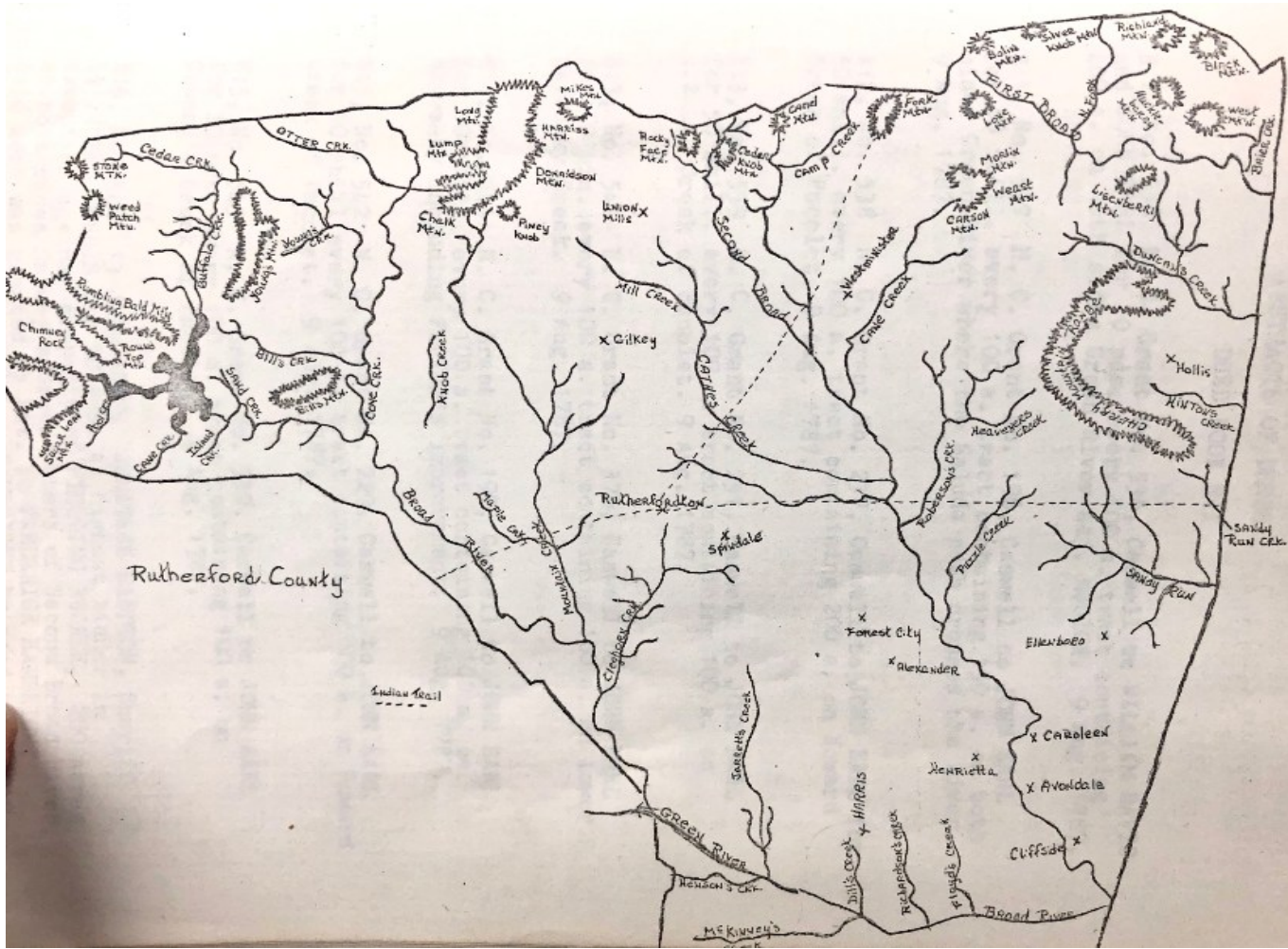

Pursuant to a precept to me directed under the hand and seal of the Honble Egerton Leigh Esq. Surv. Gen. and bearing date the 6th of Sept. 1768.
